2.1 About the Global Order Project and the Conference

3.2 Conference Tracks and Speakers

Keynote Speech

Dr. Samuel Goda (Special Representative of the OSCE Chairman-in-Office of Youth and Security)

Since his own time as a student, Samuel Goda sought to increase youth engagement and participation both in university and in society more generally. He has worked with and for several NGOs during his studies, where he became a focal point for students' initiatives at the Faculty of International Relations at the University of Economics. After having earned a Master's degree in Political Sciences and a PhD in International Relations from Matej Bel University in Banska Bystrica, Dr. Goda was a project manager and researcher for the 'Slovak Foreign Policy Association' (SFPA), Slovakia's oldest foreign policy think-tank. His work has allowed him to closely observe trends in youth participation and community development. In his current role as OSCE Special Representative of Youth and Security, his main responsibilities include representing the voice of the youth within the OSCE, advancing priority topics (such as counter-terrorism, cyber-security as well as combating discrimination and intolerance) and bringing the OSCE closer to youth.

Militarizing the Middle East: Simulation, Marketization and Realization of Insecurity

Dr. Benjamin Schütze (Arnold-Bergstraesser-Institut, Freiburg)

Benjamin Schütze earned his Master's degree and PhD in Middle Eastern Studies at the University of London. After finishing his PhD he has made practical experience amongst others at the United Nations Development Programme. During his work with Alkarama for Human Rights, he finalized a submission to the UN fact-finding Mission on Syria about crimes against humanity committed by the Syrian regime and translated testimonies of Syrian refugees about cases of torture, extra-judicial killings and illegal detention. Since April 2016 he is working at the Arnold-Berstraesser-Institut (ABI) in Freiburg and also teaches at the University of Freiburg. Besides teaching and his own academic work, Mr. Schütze is also responsible for the coordination of the ABI's research cluster Contested Governance.

Cora Alder (Center for Security Studies, ETH Zurich)

Cora Alder is a program officer in the CSS Mediation Support Team. As part of the Culture and Religion in Mediation (CARIM) program, her research focus is on religion's role in conflict and how to address religion in conflict through mediation. She is a co-organizer and trainer of the annual Religion and Mediation Course and moreover researches mediation methodology as well as developing practice and policy guidance. Prior to joining the CSS she earned a Bachelor's degree in the Study of Religions and a Master's degree in Religion-Economics-Politics at the University of Zurich and gained practical experience at the Swiss Embassy in Belgium.

International Biosecurity Cooperation & Management

Benno Weißenbacher (Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) - German Biosecurity Programme)

Mr. Weißenbacher is currently working as a project manager at the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) within the German Biosecurity Programme. The programme is part of the Federal Government's preventive security policy, and aims at the global reduction of biological threats. Mr. Weißenbacher, who holds a Master's degree in Geographical Development Studies, is seconded to the Federal Foreign Office where he supports the coordination of biosecurity activities in the 12 partner countries.

Strategies to Counter Violent Extremism: A German Case Study

Dr. Anina Schwarzenbacher (Max Planck Institute for Foreign and International Criminal Law)

Anina Schwarzenbacher studied Communication and Media Studies, Economy and Criminology at the University of Zurich and the University of Bern. She received her PhD in Sociology at Freiburg University and the Max Planck Institute for Foreign and International Criminal Law in 2017 and has since worked as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Max Planck Institute. She currently leads the research project on 'Islamist radicalization'. She is a member of both the European and the American Society of Criminology. Her current research focuses on Juvenile Delinquency, Policing and Minority Groups as well as Terrorism and Counter-Terrorism. In the last years she has given various lectures related to these topics throughout Europe and in the United States of America.

Security Governance II

Governing Armaments Collectively: Successes and Failures

Prof. Dr. Michael Brzoska (Institut für Friedensforschung und Sicherheitspolitik der Universität Hamburg)

Mr. Brzoska studied Economics and Political Sciences at the University of Hamburg and the University of Fribourg. He earned his PhD in Political Sciences at the University of Hamburg. After his PhD he worked as a Scientific Director at the Institut für Friedensforschung und Sicherheitspolitik of the University Hamburg (Institute for Peace Research and Security Policies; IFSH) and was active as a lecturer for International Relations at the University of Hamburg. He has further worked as the project leader at the Unit for the Study of Armaments, Development and Wars, Institute at the University of Hamburg and was a research member and co-director of the Arms Trade and Arms Production Team at the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute in Sweden. Currently he is working on several projects at the IFSH dealing with topics such as conventional arms control, European arms export policies and security sector reform in transition and developing countries.

Environmental Securtiy

Climate-Driven Conflict and Human Security

Dr. Mohamed Behnassi (Ibn Zohr University, Agadir)

Dr. Behnassi is a Morocco-based expert on climate governance and the impact of environmental change on human security. Holding a Master's degree in both International Relations and Political Sciences, he has published multiple peer-reviewed books and papers on food security, climate-induced conflict, and human rights in the global climate regime. Dr. Behnassi is the director of the Research Laboratory on Territorial Governance, Environment and Security (LAGOS) and of the Centre for Research on Environment, Human Security and Governance (CERES). Aimed at bridging gaps between academia and practitioners, Dr. Behnassi's work emphasizes both scholarly work and proximity to policy dynamics.
